Paradise Hill Skating Club Handbook

New to Skating?

If you are a new parent to our club and this is your first time enrolling your child in a skating program, welcome. If you are a returning parent, welcome back. Here is a guide to all the information you will need to start skating with the Paradise Hill Skating Club.

Register

The most important aspect of skating is choosing the <u>program and level</u> that is right for your child. Regardless of whether you hope to have a hockey player, speed skater, figure skater or merely want your child to learn basic skills, inspiring a love for skating is our primary goal. If you are unsure which program your child should be in please speak to our coach Andrea Salzl.

Programs Offered:

Pre-Canskate (age 3) & Canskate – ages 4 and up, including hockey players:

Designed for beginners of all ages, Canskate focuses on fun, participation and basic skill development. Skater's progress at their own rate and coaches make sessions active using teaching aids, music and a wide variety of activities that create a fun environment and promote learning.

StarSkate (Figure Skating)

Offers opportunities for skaters of all ages to develop fundamental figure skating skills in the areas of ice dance, skating skills, free skate and interpretive skating. This program teaches figure skating skills in a group and/or private lesson format. Semi private and private lessons are available from our coach, Andrea Salzl, at the rate of \$8 for 10 minutes of lesson time. This cost is billed directly to the skater from the coach. Parents are encouraged to communicate directly with our coach if semi private and private lessons are desired. All parents are encouraged to attend the skater's practice sessions so that their progress can be tracked and parents can have an open line of communication with the coach. Skaters have the opportunity to take Skate Canada Tests through a nationally standardized testing system and these private lessons prepare them for these tests.

Fee Structure

Pre-CanSkate – tentatively scheduled based on number of skaters registered and program assistants available

• \$180 for 2x/week entire season (30 min instead of 45 min)

CanSkate

- \$225 for 2x/week entire season
- \$150 for 1x/week entire season
- \$150 for 2x/week for either Nov and Dec session or Jan Mar session
- \$125 for 1x/week for either Nov and Dec session or Jan Mar session

StarSkate

- \$450 for entire season
- \$350 Jr StarSkate 5:45 7:00
- \$400 CanSkate and Jr StarSkate

*There will be a \$50 late fee applied to any registration that is not received before October 1, 2015. Skaters are not allowed on the ice until their ice fees are paid. After 2 consecutive sessions, fees cannot be refunded.

All Skaters are required to provide their own skates and accessories (guards, blade covers, skate bag, as well as appropriate skating attire).

StarSkaters may incur extra costs:

- O Coaching and Partnering Fees lessons, test days and competitions
- Music fees for the burning of CD's for solo music
- o Fees for Test days, Competitions, Seminars or workshops (optional)
- Travel and accommodations for above

Fundraising

Paradise Hill Skating Club requires its families to participate in fundraising to help off-set the cost of ice and to raise money for Club activities for your child.

- Little Caesar's pizza we ask you sell 15 units per family. You should have received your information package at registration. You can choose to do a buyout of this fundraiser for \$75. Cheque to be handed in at registration.
- Skater's Lottery (ticket books) this is a mandatory fundraiser from Skate Canada.
- Grocery Gift Cards we currently have Superstore and Paradise Foods available at Paradise Hill Agencies, Dandy Locks Hair Salon and Hair Paradise. Although this isn't a mandatory fundraiser, if you shop at any of these stores we ask you to support this fundraiser. The cards are dollar for dollar with no expiry. The stores sell them to us for a discount (4%-8%) and that is how we make our money.

Equipment

Skating Clothing

For young skaters in CanSkate, a warm pair of pants and sweater or jacket with mitts or gloves is suitable if the weather is mild. Snowsuits can be bulky and hinder the child's progress but may be necessary when the weather is cold. At the CanSkate level, **CSA** approved hockey helmet with face mask is also mandatory.

Skates - Fitting Basics

A skater's size, weight, and skating level are very important. These aspects will determine what boot and blade to purchase and how long they will last.

- Skates should fit snugly around the ankle and heel there should be room for movement, but the ankle, instep and heel must be firmly supported
- The tongue should be sufficiently wide so that it will stay in place and it should be well padded to prevent the laces from cutting into the foot
- The front opening of the boot should be sufficiently wide to pull the laces tight
- Avoid buying skates a size larger, as they tend to break down faster and hamper your child's progress and more importantly could create long term foot problems

Buying used Skates and Blades

Good used skates may be a choice for your child, especially in the beginning stages. If you do buy used skates, you may want to know a bit about the brand and model of the boot and blades you purchase. Ask your Coach about suggestions on what to look for. Sometimes a good used boot and blade set is better than an inexpensive, lower quality pair. Many skate companies have a website that describes an appropriate boot / blade combo for a particular level of skating.

Skate Sharpening

Make sure you take your skates to a reputable skate sharpener who is familiar with the edges needed in figure skating. Do not remove the bottom pick, as it is essential for proper balance.

General Care of Boots and Blades

Proper care of the boots and blades can help them last longer.

- When removing skates, unlace them enough before taking them off so that the back of the boot does not break down or rip
- Blades and soles must be dried carefully with a soft cloth
- Remove guards and wipe / wash them. Grit and dirt become lodged in the tracks of the guards. Replace guards occasionally
- Cover dried blades with soft blade covers (terry cloth or soft fabric)
- Take skates out of bag at home to let them air dry at normal temperatures to avoid rotting and rust

Test Days and Competitions (StarSkate)

Test Days

Skate Canada Clubs schedule tests for skaters at the StarSkate and CompetitiveSkate levels on an on-going basis, provided a qualified Skate Canada Evaluator or Judge is available. The coach will determine if skaters are prepared to take the test. If skaters pass a test, they then move to the next level in that discipline. If skaters are not successful, they may retry that test. Skaters must wait until the next scheduled Test Day before retrying a test.
